we will be able to refine our hybrid model to respond to community feedback and ensure a safe, effective, and timely transition to hybrid instruction.

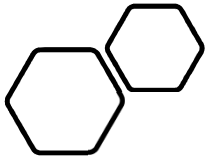


Research from districts

- Compiled one-page overviews of HS hybrid models in comparable districts

Lessons learned:

- Similarities across models
 - 2-3 days in-person per week in hybrid, lunch pick-up, etc.
- Individual implementation ideas
 - Different uses of live streaming, school-wide remote afternoons, etc.
- Contextual variables (funding, staffing, health metrics)
- Hybrid model aligned to academic strategy



Student, Family and Educator Surveys Belmont High School



Purpose

1. Collect data on the important priorities of students, families and educators.
2. Hear from the voices of stakeholders about their ideas for refinement of our remote and hybrid options.
3. Identify areas for district administrators to examine more closely.



Content

Topics included in the surveys:

Preparation and priorities for hybrid, social emotional well-being, student engagement, remote learning reflections.

Questions are open source from Panorama Education, an organization that designs K-12 surveys. Survey questions have been validated on a large national sample.



Use

How data will be collected and shared:

- Shared with HS team and advisory group
- Parent and student surveys through Rediker
- Share aggregate patterns/trends across groups at School Committee meeting

Student, Family and Educator Surveys Belmont High School: Example Questions

Students

- How would you like to be learning right now?

Families

- What aspects of schooling are most important to you and your child as we transition to a hybrid model? Select your top 2. (List of options presented).

Educators

- Compared to past years, how much harder or easier is it to form relationships with your students right now?





Advisory Group

- **Roles and Responsibilities:** Review district plans for BHS hybrid and remote implementation, review input from stakeholders, reviewing lessons learned from other hybrid models, and make recommendations to the Superintendent for consideration.
